

Diversity: Cheyenne Mountain Public Broadcast House, Inc. (CMPBH) dba KCME 88.7 FM and Jazz 93.5 FM, is a member supported, independent, public broadcast house, which provides classical music and jazz, and promotes the activities of local arts organizations and artists of all disciplines. The board and staff of CMPBH are committed to providing diverse cultural perspectives, by local programming and production of local programs, such as "KCME Culture Zone," which highlights a broad range of community activities, far beyond the scope of classical music, and "The Bridge," which explores the connections between classical music and other genres, primarily jazz. And now with the launch of a 24-hour Jazz station, we anticipate doing even more to provide diverse cultural perspectives. Currently significant air time and staff resources are devoted to creating "a community of the arts." This is accomplished by broadcasting live and locally recorded concerts, including USAF ensembles, the Colorado Springs Philharmonic, Colorado College Summer Music Festival, and Chamber Orchestra of the Springs, among many others, and by promoting the events and activities of area arts organizations through on-air public service announcements. KCME continues to air "A Day in the Life," which features renowned young playwright, hip-hop artist, and CC professor as one of its leading presences. KCME has collaborated with the Pikes Peak Library District and the Shivers Fund to bring prominent African-American operatic baritone Mark Rucker to Colorado Springs for a recital. All are welcome: women, members of all minority groups, and any others who would bring additional dimensions to the KCME mission.
